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### Financial hardship

CMHP as a charitable organisation can provide a limited number of membership subscriptions or reduced conference attendance fees for applicants with extreme financial hardship. Your request will be reviewed and a determination will be made regarding payment.

### Cancellation Policy

We regret that we have to make a charge for cancelled registrations. If you notify us of the cancellation of your reserved place giving six weeks or more prior notice to the event, 25% of the fee will be retained. From six to 3 weeks prior to the event, 50% will be retained. If between three and one week's notice is given of the cancellation for your reserved place for a CMHP event, 75% will be retained. There is no refund for non-attendance or cancellations made less than one week (7 days) prior to the event, whereupon the full fee will remain payable.
